



This winter Nakkertok Ski Club and BV Nordic did a cultural exchange funded by Experiences Canada. It was an incredible experience to be able to go across the country to meet new people and create new friendships.

The exchange started off with the Nakkertokers coming here for a week, & it was the perfect time because they were here for our snow camp, a fun training camp that we host every year with a bunch of clubs from northern BC. Skiers split up into groups from different clubs with different coaches, to learn new skills, that all led to a fun time trial that the Nakkertokers got to do too.

Next, BV Nordic skiers went to Ottawa, where we did everything from skiing at Nakkertok, skating the Rideau Canal, a scavenger hunt on Parliament Hill, to a senate tour. It was amazing to see the Canadian capital! I broke my leg (again), but despite that, everybody accommodated me. We even brought a sit ski so I could take part.

One of my many highlights was the *Coupe Skinouk*, an annual ski race held in Quebec. It was held on a soccer field, so it was flat but very windy. There was a skiathlon, where each skier skied 2 laps of 3.75 km, and in between the skier switched techniques from classic to skate and therefore also changed skis & poles. BV Skiers got some respectable results, but since I was not able to ski, I cheered a lot!

I find it really cool that Nakkertok does an exchange almost every year, for decades! I hope that Bulkley Valley Nordic follows along with that tradition. We did quite a bit of local fundraising but without Experiences Canada, we would not have been able to do this exchange!






In 1994, the Buchfink family, who shared a deep love for skiing & the outdoors, was tragically lost in a helicopter crash. Canine Skier Interview:

Benji Wickham interviews Cova Luxmoore

Benji: Introduce yourself, tell the club a bit about you.

Cova: My name is Cova, I'm 11 years old & I love skiing on the trails with literally anybody. We've always just skied the main dog loop but I've wondered where those unknown trails lead, why can I never go on them? Maybe they're cat trails instead of dog trails? Maybe there's a big bad wolf patrolling them? sadly, I have no idea.

Benji: What's the worst thing your human has done on the ski trails?

Cova: Well, when we were on the dog trails (it happens every time) I was strategically looking for a spot to lay my dookie down, & they disrupted my process! When I finally picked a spot to poop, and it was on *my* territory too, they picked it up & moved it! Can you believe that? That's equivalent of me jumping onto the table & eating their food, yeah, we love doing it, but they hate it when we do it. Either way this behaviour is utterly disgraceful.

Benji: What's your worst ski pole, ski, and/or leash, entanglement experience?

Cova: Once my people & I were going for a routine afternoon ski, but this time my people had the audacity to bring this "guest" dog with us. So naturally the two of us started to play, then my owner & I got tangled up during this precious play time. Since my human was also carrying poles, skis and our leashes, well, it was beyond their competencies. They tried to split us up, but they ended up falling over and getting completely tangled. This was another example of more disgraceful activity from my people, and they had the nerve to blame us.









Benji: What's your take on dog booties?

Cova: Whenever my people put dog booties on me prior to our routine ski, they give me the *ick* for the first five minutes or so, but then I realize that I'm a fashion icon whenever I have them on! When I see other dogs on the trails, I always try to show them off. My idea for the perfect dog bootie would be having great hot flames on the side so when I was galloping through the snow looking majestic, I will be able to go even faster than I already do. Now, whenever my people and I are going for a ski, I try to make them put the booties on me so I can look down on the lower class of dogs, you know, the ones without booties.
